The Grant Wood AEA CISM team members include social workers, school psychologists, clergy members, teachers, counselors, administrators, and community volunteers. We serve 32 school districts and offer school-based, timely support when critical events impact a school.

- Strategic planning
- On-site team support
- Group interventions
- Defusings and debriefing after an event
- Staff training
- Individual interventions for staff and students
- Follow-up and referral

The mission of the Grant Wood AEA Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) team is to support GWAEA schools in coping with critical incidents by providing trained, local community response teams.

CONSIDERATIONS FOR RESPONDING TO A CRITICAL INCIDENT:

- Be careful not to overload people with information. Let their questions be your guide.
- Listen to the students and staff. Let them talk about their thoughts and fears, and ask their own questions.
- Be aware that others' reactions may be very different from your own.
- Provide empathy for feelings, which may cover a considerable range.
- Identify the support people available to talk with students and staff.
- Be fairly consistent with classroom routine following a critical incident while making allowances for individual needs.
